DIVERSITY OF WILDLIFE
 Many species of wildlife call Mirasol home! While on a nature walk throughout our golf courses and property, you could see animals and birds from bobcats (pictured), deer (tracks pictured at right), and wild boar to turkeys and roseate spoonbills (pictured).



AQUATIC HABITATS
 The property at Mirasol includes 47 interconnected freshwater lakes. Our lakes are home to many different species of fish, waterfowl, reptiles, and birds including large mouth bass, river otters (pictured), mottled ducks (pictured), and the American white ibis (pictured).



In order to maintain the pristine quality of these bodies of water and the creatures that inhabit them, our golf course maintenance department created berms next to the lakes in the areas that are near where chemicals are used, in order to eliminate the possibility of runoff.



NATIVE PLANTINGS
 The inflorescence of the muhly grass pictured at the right is not only beautiful, it is also useful to our small creatures! Planted in groupings, it provides shelter for small animals and insects, and is a source for food and nests for songbirds.



The preserve areas and planting beds that surround our courses are comprised of native species of trees, shrubs, and flowers. Native plantings require less maintenance and fewer chemicals than non-native varieties, and they help preserve our area's natural heritage.



BUTTERFLIES
 Butterflies abound on our course! Among the many species that call Mirasol home, you'll see Zebra Longwings, Monarchs, Great Southern Whites, Fiery Skippers and Eastern Tiger Swallowtails (pictured).



RECYCLING EFFORTS AT THE CLUBHOUSE
 The Country Club at Mirasol is committed to reducing and reusing wherever possible. Recycling stations are located in administrative offices, at the back of the Clubhouse and at The Esplanade for bottles and paper.

To save energy, our tennis court lighting system is equipped with timers, and our Golf Pro Shop utilizes tees, signage, and course furnishings that are made of recycled and degradable materials.



LOXAHATCHEE SLOUGH
 The Loxahatchee Slough area is the largest and most biologically diverse natural area managed by Palm Beach County. We are fortunate to be able to access part of the Slough at the edge of our property by foot and by golf cart.

Various flora and fauna call the Slough home, and on any given day, you will see pineland daisy, fringed yellow stargrass, Florida applesnail, cormorants, anhingas (pictured), and striped mud turtles (pictured).
